In February of 2016, I decided I needed to go to camp to get help for my problems. I got much more help than I could have ever hoped for. With the help of my group I was able to grow out of my bad attitude into a skilled, responsible, and caring young adult.

Camp is unique from other types of therapy because it relies heavily on the group setting which nurtures mutual trust and dependence. The group is just like family, they don't let you get away with anything and will stick with you and your problems, no matter what.

Instead of just dealing with the symptoms like my school had done, my group really helped me to dig deep and find the root of my problems. Only then was I able to deal with them. And, as I helped others in the group solve their problems, it helped me put my own issues in perspective. Today, I am able to handle problems in a constructive manner.

meetings, Cole, was accepted and started there in February of 2016. When he left home he hated reading and writing. When he graduated, he had become a prolific writer and developed a habit of reading.

Shortly after graduating, Cole was offered an internship at The Lexington County Chronicle Newspaper where I also write. He did such a good job that within a short time he was tasked with posting news stories in the paper and online. Today he writes a monthly column that appears on the front page of the sports section.

On a family vacation before camp, we visited a State Park. We enjoyed it so much that Cole and I set a goal of visiting all 47 South Carolina parks. Cole's camp stay interrupted that goal, but we would visit parks during home visits. We were able to visit our final park soon after his graduation.
